GENERAL INFORMATION

Weeklong School

This is the 49th anniversary of the CUPE Weeklong School in Manitoba. The Weeklong School provides a community atmosphere where learning, relaxation and fun are combined. The objective is to give CUPE leaders the opportunity to develop specialized skills in programs that are interesting and challenging.

<u>Cost</u>

Includes rooms, meals, and registration from Sunday afternoon to Friday noon. Costs are per person as follows:

- \$935 for single rooms.
- **\$710 for double occupancy** (sharing room with another delegate).

<u>Note:</u> Please <u>do not</u> book rooms directly with the Russell Inn. We will assign rooms to the delegates, based on the requirements indicated on their registration forms. The Russell Inn is a **non-smoking facility**, however, members who smoke will be permitted to do so outside on their hotel room patio.

- Children:
 - No cost for children under 3 years old participating in meals.
 - For children over 3 years old, the Russell Inn will arrange individual meal plans.
 - Limited space is available at three Russell day care facilities for minimal cost.
 Participants are asked to contact Shirley Campbell at the Russell Inn directly to make child care arrangements. The hotel will charge the applicable costs to the parents and they will be responsible for paying upon check-out. - Spouses:
 - If delegates would like to bring their spouse, the Russell Inn will arrange a meal plan. There is no charge for a spouse who does not participate in the meal plan, however, the delegate must pay the single occupancy rate.
- Special Diets:
 - Participants requiring special meals as a result of food allergies/restrictions or who follow religious/life choice diets are requested to contact the Russell Inn directly with their special dietary requirements <u>at least 10 working days in advance of the school</u> to arrange an alternate menu plan. BURSARIES

Two bursaries are available from **CUPE Manitoba**, as follows:

#1. Locals in Financial Need:

The first bursary in the amount of **\$1,000** is available to a small local or a local in financial need. Where there is more than one local applying, priority will be given to locals most in need of financial assistance and/or to a local sending a participant who has not been to the CUPE Weeklong School before.

#2. Human Rights Workshop Bursary:

The second bursary in the amount of **\$750.00** is available to a delegate registering for the Human Rights workshop and who belongs to one of the following equity-seeking groups:

- Aboriginal Worker
- Racialized Worker
- LGBTTI Worker
- Worker with a Disability
- Female Worker

Where there is more than one local applying, priority will be given to a member who has never been to the CUPE Weeklong School, who is a diversity activist, and who belongs to a local in need of financial assistance.

A bursary application form is included in this package. A copy of your local's last Trustees' Report must accompany all bursary applications.

Deadline for all bursary applications is <u>April 24, 2015</u>. Recipients will be advised of the decision of the CUPE Manitoba Executive by early May.
